6:00 p.m. Glyndon Days Discussion Meeting
City Hall Council Chambers

1. **Call to Order:** Mayor Cecil Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
2. **Roll Call:** Council Members Present: Dave Owings, Justin Schreiber, Joe Olson and Kimberly Savageau, City Clerk Wendy Affield, and Administrative Assistant Susan Dayley.
3. **Parade Update from Dave Owings**
 - Taylor (Pike from Big 98.7) Peterson will be the announcer.
 - Amber Wang, Senior at DGF, will be singing the National Anthem.
 - Bill Dally will take care of the sound system for the National Anthem.
 - Tracy Tollefson requested a mailing list from Jerry Anderson, Dilworth Loco Days Committee Representative. He needs to get approval from the committee before it can be released.
 - Parade forms can be picked up at City Hall or downloaded from the City Website and emailed to parade@glyndonmn.com
 - Have emailed businesses the information regarding the parade.
 - The Glyndon Days Facebook page has been updated.
 - Cub Scouts will be in the parade.
 - Color Guard – will follow up with Jason Hicks.
 - Dilworth VFW will be in the parade as per Jason Hicks.
 - Grand Marshall – will be decided at a later date. Owings asked if anyone has a suggestion to please let him know. They should be a lifelong resident of Glyndon.

Owings requested documentation from each Council Member concerning the procedures that were completed by each person for Glyndon Days, this will help guide new participants when coordinating.

Kimberly Savageau requested parade forms be available at the Community Center during the Ice Cream Social on Wednesday, June 7, 2017. She would also like the portable sign placed outside during the Ice Cream Social to inform residents the dates of Glyndon Days.

Discussion was had about a large banner to hang across Parke Avenue. Council directed Affield and Dayley to visit with Lofgren concerning quotes for a banner.

Kimberly Savageau stated, we need to coordinate with Bill Bergquist, Clay County Sherriff, to help block traffic for the parade line up on 12th Avenue. The classic cars will line up on the east side of 12th and Parke and the remainder of the parade participants will line up to the west of Parke Avenue. Car Cruise lineup will start at 9:30 a.m. with the other parade participants starting at 9:45 a.m. Car cruise begins at 10:45 a.m., parade at 11:00 a.m.

Council members agreed since they would be setting up the parade and activities after the parade they would not be able to ride on a float. Affield and Dayley were instructed to design a float that would carry Mayor Johnson and City Staff. Kimberly Savageau stated, candy is not to be thrown from a moving vehicle.

4. Events Update from Joe Olson

- Tracy Tollefson with Community Ed would like to coordinate vendors to sell items in the High School Gymnasium.
- Will contact Maranatha and Glyndon Lutheran Churches regarding food sales on Saturday.
- Will contact The Hill Lounge and Morty's Bar and Grill regarding their schedule of events.
- Nate Paulson will coordinate the Rescue 5k Run/Walk on Friday, August 11, 2017. Discussion concerning the possibility of including a child/pet/family walk.
- Kim Gordon is offering to provide clown services. A question was asked if she does the balloon sculpting.
- Discussion concerning having more events to keep people around Saturday after the parade. Some ideas were having a horseshoe tournament, minnow races or bingo. Thoughts were to see if the Glyndon Lions & Lionesses would provide bingo in the afternoon at the Community Center.

5. Street Dance Update from Justin Schreiber

- Confident that Home Town Zero band will play at the Street Dance. Waiting for confirmation. Cost for band will be \$2,000 or less.
- Has one food vendor lined up that sells cheese curds, funnel cakes, pulled pork sandwiches, corndogs, chips and drinks. The vendor has two food trailers and would be able to serve for the activities during the day and the Street Dance in the evening.
- The Street Dance will be held in the Community Center parking lot.
- Will contact Rod & Gun Club for serving alcohol for the dance.
- Will contact sponsorships for renting porta potty's, flatbed trailer for the band stage, etc.


6. Information from Kimberly Savageau and Wendy Affield


- The City provides the corn for the picnic on Thursday, August 10, 2017. The Girl Scouts provide the rest of the meal with a free will donation.
- Games to Go charge \$150 per hour for face painting services, with a minimum of two hours plus mileage.
- Games to Go have an assortment of games for various prices along with Dippin Dots, Cotton Candy machine and Sno Cone machine. Popular inflatables are Hoops Challenge, Bungee Run, and the Bounce-n-Slides.
- Balloon artist is \$80 per hour, with a minimum of two hours through Games to Go.


