

Glyndon Days Meeting
Discussion Session #1
6:00 p.m. on 4/25/2018
City Hall - Council Chambers

1. **Call to Order:** Mayor Cecil Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
2. **Roll Call:** Council Members Present: Justin Schreiber, Joe Olson, Kimberly Savageau, Dave Owings arrived at 6:23 p.m., and Administrative Assistant Susan Dayley.

Items 4, 5 and 6 were discussed prior to Item 3.

3. **Parade Discussion - Dave Owings**

- Owings explained due to Parke Avenue being under construction, it would be best to line up the parade participants in Stockwood on 2nd Street and Stockwood Avenue. The parade would then continue on 2nd Street to Pleasantview Avenue, north to 1st Street ending at Morty's Bar and Maranatha Church. Mayor Johnson suggested lining up at the baseball field on Partridge and 7th Street. Owings thought it may be difficult for the bigger rigs in the parade to make the left hand turn on 2nd Street. Savageau commented it would keep the flow of traffic going if lined up in Stockwood. Schreiber stated we could also line up by Morty's Bar and head towards Stockwood. There was discussion among Council and noted there could be three (3) rows of parade participants lined up in Stockwood and direct each participant when to go.
- Schreiber stated the Shriners will not be able to be in the parade due to the uneven streets.

4. **Street Dance Update & Food Vendors - Justin Schreiber**

- Downtown Sound Band has been booked to play at the street dance for \$2,500.00. Council suggested having a \$10.00 cover charge. If there is inclement weather the band will be moved inside the Community Center.
- Schreiber talked to the individual who had the food truck in the Community Center parking lot last year at Glyndon Days. She may have two food trucks available and they would set up on Saturday, August 11th and stay open until the dance is over at 1:00 a.m.
- Savageau suggested posting the band information on the Glyndon Days Facebook page to create an event. Schreiber stated the band provides advertising signs to promote the event. Savageau stated if they have an event on Facebook page, Glyndon Days Facebook page should be able to share the event.
- Schreiber will contact businesses to find sponsorships for the band, porta potties, flatbed trailer for the band stage, etc.
- Dance will be held in the Community Center parking lot, Schreiber will check with Chief Cline about wristbands for the event. Schreiber is hoping to get volunteers to help with the event.
- Schreiber stated he would like to have recycle bins available during Glyndon Days. Savageau stated we can get the plastic bottle recycle bins from the County at no cost.
- Rod & Gun Club will be selling and serving the alcohol at the dance.
- Olson wondered if an account was set up to have funds accounted for when accepting donations for Glyndon Days. Dayley confirmed we do have an account set up for Glyndon Days in the Budget. Schreiber stated we can have signs made for the sponsors who donate money or products to the Glyndon Days events.

5. Picnic Discussion – Kimberly Savageau

- The Community Picnic will be held at 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 9, 2018.
- Chief Cline organizes the corn contribution for the picnic.
- The Girl Scouts, in the past, have provided the rest of the meal with a free will donation. Savageau will contact Girl Scouts and ask if they will be serving food at the picnic this year.

6. Saturday Activities – Joe Olson


- Olson would like a contact list from last year of the vendors the City worked with when organizing Glyndon Days. Dayley will create a contact list with the names, phone numbers and business.
- Olson stated he would like the vendors in an alternate location other than the school. Olson prefers to organize the vendors this year and will contact Tracy Tollefson from Community Ed to discuss this with her. Olson suggested the vendors be at the east end of the park by the Community Center and move out to the street if needed. Parents who are waiting for their children playing on the games can visit the vendor booths.
- Olson will discuss with Tracy Tollefson details on the 3 on 3 Basketball Tournament. Last year this was held on Wednesday evening.
- The Golf Tournaments are hosted by the local bars.
- Schreiber would like to have two bigger games for the older kids along with several games for the younger children. Schreiber suggested checking with Games Galore to see what they have to offer. Last year we had an obstacle course game the 7-9-year-old kids played on but we should have something for the older kids to be involved with.
- Games to Go have an assortment of games for various prices along with Dippin Dots, Cotton Candy machine and Sno-Cone machine. Popular games are Hoops Challenge, Bungee Run, and Choo-Choo Train Bounce-n-Slide.
- Balloon artist is \$80 per hour, with a minimum of two hours through Games to Go.
- Dayley will contact Gayle Robertson from the Lions and Lionesses regarding lunch being served on Saturday after the parade.

7. Glyndon Days Budget - \$5,000.00 for Picnic/Saturday Activities.


8. Open Forum – Owings conveyed the vendors at the Potato Days event in Barnesville are notified 4-5 months in advance but do not commit until closer to the event day. Owings would like to advertise for vendors in the Barnesville paper. Savageau informed Council there are 75 students registered through Community Ed for the Prairie Fire Children's Theatre Camp being held the week of Glyndon Days. The performances will take place on Friday August 10th at 7:00 p.m. and Saturday August 11th at 1:00 p.m. Savageau reminded Council they should keep this in mind when planning activities.
