6:00 p.m. Glyndon Discussion Meeting #2
City Hall Council Chambers

1. **Call to Order:** Mayor Cecil Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
2. **Roll Call:** Council Members Present: Dave Owings, Justin Schreiber, Joe Olson, Kimberly Savageau and City Clerk Wendy Affield.

3. Parade Update from Dave Owings:

- The parade route will stay the same as last year since the Parke Avenue Project has been postponed until next year.
- Labels will be given to Dayley so letters concerning the parade can be sent out.
- Received an email from the Alexandria Drummers asking if we would like them to participate in our parade. Owings stated, they would expect to be paid to come and play.
- Updated parade forms have been sent to Dayley.
- Last year the parade had fifty-eight (58) units.
- Shriners also require a donation to participate in the parade.
- Grand Marshall and Parade Announcer still need to be found. Savageau mentioned asking Kristina Dernier from Glyndon Lutheran to announce the parade.

4. Street Dance Update from Justin Schreiber:

- Visited with Troy DeJong from Glyndon Rod and Gun concerning the beer garden during the street dance. Schreiber is not sure if they will sell during the daily activities, it might just be during the dance. Rod & Gun will discuss it at their next meeting.
- Working with Jim on using a trailer for the band to set up on.
- Savageau will share "Downtown Sounds" Facebook/Website page on the Glyndon Days Facebook page to help promote the dance. Street Dance will run from 8:00 p.m. to midnight. Cover charge will be \$10.00 per person. Must be 21 years old to attend the dance.
- Food vendor is lined up. Food truck will serve both the activities during the day and the dance in the evening.
- Porta potties are lined up.
- Schreiber stated, he is working on getting sponsorships to help with the expenses of Glyndon Days.
- Have Lofgren check with the Sentence to Serve Supervisor to see if a crew would be available to help set up the fencing for the dance.
- Other than a church coming in to serve food (they are exempt) the seller would need to have a Special Event Permit from the County. The Community Center is also exempt.
- Lions/Lionesses will be serving a lunch on Saturday, August 11, 2018 in the Community Center.

5. Community Picnic Update from Kimberly Savageau:

- Savageau stated there is not a Girl Scouts group in Glyndon anymore so we will need to find another group to serve at the Community Picnic. Council discussed how to fairly choose another group to serve. Council mentioned a few groups and decided to ask Terry Sperr with the Trap Team since he was involved with Glyndon Days years prior.
- The menu served last year by the Girl Scouts; hot dogs, chips, cookies and lemonade. The corn on the cob was donated by Greenleaf Nursery and served by Council.
- Chief Cline will order the corn for the picnic.

6. Saturday Activities Update from Joe Olson

- The vendor event will not be in the School Gymnasium this year, Olson will reach out to a few vendors to see if they are interested in setting up around the park.
- Still looking for a face painter. Affield stated we can hire a face painter through Games to Go.
- Terry Sperr will be running the tractor pull. Council will need to discuss an amount to donate at the next meeting.
- Olson will put together a “to-do” list for Affield and Dayley.
- Owings brought up the discussion of making sure all Maintenance Employees are on duty for the Glyndon Days festival. Owings asked Affield if anyone has requested vacation for those days. Affield stated she is not aware of any at this time and remembers making a statement to Lofgren last year concerning Council’s request for all maintenance personnel to work Glyndon Days in 2018.
- Affield informed Council she checked prices for the inflatable games with both Games Galore and Games to Go. Games to Go came in with lower pricing on most items and we received a \$50.00 gift card from them after last years booking.
- Council gave Affield direction to book the bouncy houses for Saturday’s activities with a \$2,100.00 budget.
- Affield will match the cost from last year for the Community Picnic bouncy house on Thursday.

Council scheduled the next Glyndon Days Planning Meeting for Wednesday, June 27th, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in the Glyndon City Hall Council Chambers.
