

ORDINANCES, RULES, REGULATIONS, AND BY-LAWS

the Village of Glyndon, Clay County, Minn.

Village Ordinance No. 7

An ordinance relating to Estrays.

The village council of the Village of Glyndon do ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. No cattle, horses, mules, asses, sheep or swine shall be allowed to go at large within the village limits.

Sec. 2. Any horse, cow or any other animal, hitched or fastened in any manner so that same can injure (by removing baskets,) any tree upon any street or alley or in any public park of the village, shall be deemed to be stray and shall be taken up as provided for in section three of this ordinance.

Sec. 3. It shall be the duty of the village constable or marshal to take up all strays found within the village limits, and his fee therefor is hereby fixed at fifty cents (50c) for each animal so taken up, provided that when more than one animal belonging to the same person be taken up at the same time his fee therefor shall be fifty cents (50c) for the first and twenty five cents (25c) for each additional animal, and in addition thereto the necessary expenses incurred in taking care of the stock while in his possession; the above fees and expenses to be collected by officer before delivery is made to owner of stock.
