

ORDINANCE NO. 80

An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 48 which Ordinance No. 48 establishes a municipal water system for the City of Glyndon, Clay County, Minnesota.

BE IT ENACTED by the City County of the City of Glyndon as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 21 of Ordinance No. 48, which is an ordinance establishing a municipal water system for the Village of Glyndon, Clay County, Minnesota, is hereby amended so that, after amended, the section shall read as follows:

"Section 21 - Water Rates:

- A. The rate due and payable by each water user within the city for water taken from the city water system shall be as follows:
- a. For each residence, \$5.00 per month,
 - b. For apartment buildings, \$4.00 per month per apartment;
 - c. For restaurants, dairy farms, vegetable and flower markets, potato washers, beauty shops and liquor stores, \$25.00 per month;
 - d. For churches and all other commercial establishments to include motels, grocery stores, post office, service stations, elevators, banks, fertilizer plants, electrical shops, office buildings, and craft shops, \$5.00 per month;
 - e. School District No. 145, \$150.00 per month.
- B. The foregoing charges are payable quarterly.
- C. Rates due and payable by each water user located beyond the territory limits of the city shall be determined by special contract."

SECTION 2. A new Section 31 is hereby added to Ordinance No. 48 as set forth above to read as follows:

"Section 30 - Amendment

- A. The City Council of the City of Glyndon may, by resolution, from time to time, alter and revise the charges set forth in the preceding section and shall thereafter post such altered charges and publish the same along with the minutes of the meetings of the City Council."

SECTION 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after its passage and publication.
