

ORDINANCES, RULES, REGULATIONS, AND BY-LAWS

Village of Glyndon, Clay County, Minn.

Village Ordinance No 10.

All ordinances relating to discharge of firearms within the village limits.

The Village council of the Village of Glyndon do ordain as follows:.

Sec. 1. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person to discharge or cause to be discharged, any gun, pistol, revolver or other firearm within the limits of this village provided, however, that if the person so discharging any gun, pistol, revolver or other firearm shall do so in defense of his person or property or in defense of the person or property of any member of his family, or if any gun, revolver or other firearm shall be discharged in the hands of any person while prosecuting his lawful business and the said business shall require the discharge of the same, then and in any of the above events it shall not be unlawful to discharge the same.

Sec. 2. The trustees or council may grant permission to any person or association of persons to use firearms within the limits of the village as such locality as the council may designate for the purpose of entertainment or practice.

Sec. 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not more than two dollars (\$2.00) nor less than two dollars (\$2.00) together with the costs of prosecution and in default of payment of such fine and costs shall be imprisoned in the county jail not to exceed ten days.
