

ORDINANCES, RULES, REGULATIONS, AND BY-LAWS

of the Village of Glyndon, Clay County, Minn.

Village Ordinance No 11

An ordinance relating to unlawful sale of intoxicating liquors.

The village council of the Village of Glyndon do ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. Whoever shall sell, barter, give away, furnish or dispose of in any manner or under any pretext, directly or indirectly, or by agent, employe, or otherwise, any spirituous, vinous, fermented or malt liquors within the said Village of Glyndon, in a quantity less than five (5) gallons, without first having obtained a license therefor, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall upon conviction thereof before any justice of the peace of said village, be fined for every such offense in a sum not less than twenty five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) together with the costs of prosecution; and in default of payment of such fine and costs shall be committed to the county jail for a term of not less than thirty (30) days, nor more than ninety (90) days, in the discretion of the justice. All prosecutions for violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance may be tried in a summary manner before any justice of the peace of said village. Provided that the provisions of this section shall not be so construed as to prohibit any regularly licensed druggist from dispensing liquors in filling prescriptions made by any regular, reputable and duly licensed physician in the practice of his profession.

Sec 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
