Village Ordinance No 2.

An ordinance to prevent the obstruction of street crossings.

The Village Council of the Village of Glyndon do ordain as follows:-

Section 1. All railroad companies and all persons are forbidden to obstruct any street crossing so as to prevent the free use thereof by the public for a longer time than ten minutes, accident excepted.

Sec 2. Every Railroad company and every person in the employment of such company, or any other person, that violates or that causes or permits to be violated the provisions of this ordinance, shall on conviction thereof be liable to a fine of not more than fifty dollars, (\$50.00) nor less than five dollars (\$5.00) together with the costs attending such conviction, and in failure to pay such fine and costs such person or persons may be committed to the county jail, there to remain till such fine and costs are paid, or till discharged according to law.

Sec 3. And it is hereby made the duty of the constable of said village to make complaint and prosecute in his official capacity all violations of the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after its publication.
