

ORDINANCES, RULES, REGULATIONS, AND BY-LAWS

the Village of Glyndon, Clay County, Minn.

Village Ordinance No. 9

An ordinance relating to use of billiard, pool & Tivoli tables and gaming with cards & dice by minors.

The village council of the Village of Glyndon do ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person owning, leasing or having in charge any billiard, pool, Tivoli or other gaming table, or any bowling alley, in any hotel, saloon or other public place of this village, to allow the same to be used in any manner by any minor, or any person under the age of twenty one (21) years.

Sec. 2. No person owning, leasing or having in charge any building used as a public house, shall permit or allow any gaming with cards or shaking of dice or any other form of gaming or the use of these or similar games for any purpose whatsoever, in any manner, by any minor or any person under the age of twenty one (21) years.

Sec. 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be subject to a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than twenty dollars (\$20.00) together with the costs of prosecution, and on failure to pay such fine and costs shall be imprisoned in the county jail not to exceed fifteen days.
