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ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO LICENSE AND REGULATE THE KEEPING OF BEES WITHIN THE VILLAGE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF GLYNDON AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND CANCELLATION OF SUCH LICENSE

The Village Council of the Village of Glyndon do hereby ordain as follows:

1. That in order to prevent the keeping of bees within the village limits from becoming a nuisance to the public and to owners of property adjoining the premises upon which bees are kept, it is necessary that said business be so regulated and controlled as to prevent such nuisance.

2. No person, firm or corporation shall keep bees within the village limits of the Village of Glyndon without first obtaining a license therefor as hereinafter provided.

3. Any person, firm or corporation desiring to keep bees or to maintain an apiary within the village limits of the Village of Glyndon shall file with the Clerk of the Village a written application for license therefor, stating the name and address of applicant and a legal description of the premises upon which the said bees are to be kept or said apiary maintained, together with a statement of the number of hives proposed to be kept and the character of the equipment in caring for the bees or maintaining said apiary. The Village Clerk shall present such application to the Village Council at its next regular meeting; the Council shall in its discretion grant or refuse such license. The Council in granting any such license may impose such reasonable regulations as shall be necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance. If the license is granted, applicant shall pay to the Village Treasury therefor, the license fee of one dollar. Said license shall be for one year from the date granted and shall be in writing giving name and address of licensee and describing the premises upon which said business of

keeping bees and maintaining an apiary is to be conducted. It shall be issued by the Village Clerk under the seal of the Village and signed by the mayor and Clerk.

4. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor and shall upon conviction be punished by a fine not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the ^{county} Village jail of Clay County for not more than ninety days. Each day of such violation shall be deemed a separate offense hereunder.

5. The Village Council may, for cause known, revoke such license as herein provided for, upon ten days notice to the licensee and affording him or her an opportunity to be heard in opposition thereto. Such notice shall be in writing and issued by the Clerk addressed to the licensee, and shall state the time and place of hearing and shall have attached thereto a copy of the specifications upon which the revocation shall be based; this notice shall be served upon the licensee in the same manner as a summons in a civil action. Provided, however, that upon the conviction of this Ordinance said license may be revoked without notice to the licensee.

6. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
