

An Ordinance

Relating to the sale of non-intoxicating malt liquor.

The Village Council of the Village of Glyndon do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Non-intoxicating malt liquor within the meaning of this ordinance shall be held to be any malt liquor or beverage which contains one-half of one per centum or more of alcohol by weight and within the maximum provided by law.

Section Two. No person shall vend, deal in or dispose of by gift, sale or otherwise, any non-intoxicating malt liquor without first having obtained a license so to do, from the Village Council.

Section Three. The annual fee for an "On sale" license shall be fifty dollars and for an "off sale" license shall be five dollars, and all license fees shall be adjusted so that the license period shall be from July 1st to July first of the following year. Amendment to Section Three. At a regular meeting of the village council held June 3d, 1933

Section 3 of this ordinance was amended to read "\$60.00 for and "on sale" license".

Section Four. No person shall sell non-intoxicating malt liquor to any person under twenty one years of age, nor to any person who is apparently intoxicated.

Section Five. Non intoxicating malt liquor shall not be consumed on any street, sidewalk, alley or park within the Village of Glyndon.

Section Six. No licensee shall sell such malt liquor at any time on Sunday, or on any general, special or primary election, or any other day between the hours of eleven o'clock at night and six o'clock of the following morning.

Amendment to Section Six. At a regular meeting of the Village Council held July 3d, 1933 Section 6 of this ordinance was amended to permit the sale of beer on Sunday during the same hours as other days.

Amendment to Section Six. At a regular meeting of the Village Council held May 7th, 1934 Section 6 of this ordinance was amended to read "12 O'clock Midnight instead of 11 P.M."

Amendment to Section Six. At a Special meeting of the Village Council held June 28th, 1935 Section 6 of this ordinance was again amended to read "12.30 A.M."

Section Seven. No "on sale" license shall be granted to any applicant who is not the actual owner and operator of a restaurant or hotel where food is served.

Section Eight. No "on sale" license shall be granted to any place of business located on or adjacent to Trunk Highway No 2 as the same is located in the village.

Amendment to Section Eight. At a regular meeting of the Village Council held May 7th, 1934 Dec 4th, 1933 Section Eight of this ordinance was annulled.

Section Nine. Applications for license shall be in writing on forms provided by the village council and shall contain full information on all matters required therein by the council.

Section Ten. Any person who shall make any false statement in the application for license herein provided for or who shall deceive or attempt to deceive the village council, or who shall not comply with all the requirements of this ordinance, shall be deemed to have violated the provisions of this ordinance.

Section Eleven. No licensee shall keep or permit the keeping of intoxicating liquor on or about his place of business and shall not permit the "spiking" of malt liquor with alcohol or other hard liquor, and shall not permit intoxicated persons to loiter about such place of business.

Section Twelve. The place in which such malt liquors are served shall not contain any booths or screens and shall be in full view of the public from the street at all times.

Section Thirteen. The Village council may grant or deny any application, and if the same is granted, it may be revoked by the village council at any time without notice or hearing.

Section Fourteen. The premises named in any license, shall at all times when open to the public, be also open to inspection and examination by any police officer or member of the village council.

Section Fifteen. Sales of such malt liquor under an "onsale" license shall be made only for consumption on the premises at tables or lunch counters where food is generally served, and sales under an "off sale" license shall be made in the original package as the same is defined by law or as it shall be construed by the courts, to be consumed off the

Section Sixteen. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the village or county jail for not more than 90 days.

Section Seventeen. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
