

ORDINANCE NO. 62

ORDINANCE RELATING TO ACTS CONSTITUTING
DISORDERLY CONDUCT WITHIN THE VILLAGE
OF GLYNDON

Be it ordained by the Village Council of the Village of Glyndon as follows:

Section 1. Whoever does any of the following in a public or private place, knowing, or having reasonable grounds to know that it will, or will tend to, alarm, anger or disturb others or provoke an assault or breach of the peace is guilty of the offense of disorderly conduct:

- A. Engages in brawling or fighting; or
- B. Disturbs an assembly or meeting, not unlawful in its character; or
- C. Engages in offensive, obscene, or abusive language or in boisterous and noisy conduct tending reasonably to arouse alarm, anger, or resentment in others.

Section 2. Whoever violates the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to imprisonment in the County Jail for not more than 90 days or to pay a fine of not more than \$300.00, or both.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication.
