## ORDINANCE NO. 59

## ORDINANCE RELATING TO FORBIDDEN ACTS OR STATEMENTS OF MINORS

Be it ordained by the Village Council of the Village of Glyndon as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for (a) a minor to enter any premises licensed for the retail sale of alcoholic beverages or any municipal liquor store for the purpose of purchasing, or having served or delivered to him, or her, any alcoholic beverage containing more than one half of one percent of alcohol by volume or (b) a minor to consume any intoxicating liquor or to purchase, attempt to purchase or have another purchase for him or her any intoxicating liquor; or (c) any person to misrepresent or misstate his or her age, or the age of any other person for the purpose of inducing any licensee or any employee of any licensee, or any employee of any municipal liquor store, to sell, serve or deliver any alcoholic beverage to a minor; or (d) a minor to have in his possession any intoxicating liquor, with intent to consume same at a place other than the household of his parent or quardian. Possession of such intoxicating liquor at a place other than the household of his parent or guardian shall be prima facie evidence of intent to consume the same at a place other than the household of his parent or guardian.

Section 2. A minor shall be defined in this ordinance as any individual under 21 years of age.

Section 3. Whoever violates the provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to imprisonment in the County Jail for not more than 90 days or to pay a fine of not more than \$300.00, or both.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and shall be in full force, and effect after its passage and publication.
