Village of Glyndon, Clay County, Minn.

Village Ordinance #18

An ordinance prohibiting persons under 16 years of age from being on the streets of the Village of Glyndon at night.

Be it ordained by the Village of Glyndon as follows:

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person under 16 years of age to be on or about any of the streets, alleys or public grounds within the Village of Glyndon between the hours of 9 o'clock p.m. and 5 o'clock a.m. during that portion of the year between the 1st day of March and 1st day of September following, and between the hours of 8.30 o'clock p.m. and five o'clock a.m. during that portion of the year between the 1st day of September and the 1st day of March following.

Provided however that this ordinance shall not apply to any person accompanied by his or her parent or other legal custodian or any such person engaged or employed in any lawful business requiring him or her to be upon the streets, alleys or public grounds of the village or to any person going to, or from such business or occupation, or to any ^{such} person upon an errand or duty directed by parents, guardian or employer, but in any such case minor person shall not loiter on the way.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any parent or other legal custodian of any person under 16 years of age, to allow or permit any such child or ward or other person under such age to go or be or loiter upon or about any of the streets, alleys or public places in the Village of Glyndon within and between the hours named and prohibited in section one of this ordinance unless there exists a reasonable necessity therefor.

Sec. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of the foregoing sections of this ordinance shall be

conviction be fined not exceeding ten dollars and costs, and in default of payment of such fine and costs shall be imprisoned in the village jail or in the common jail of Clay county for a period not exceeding eight days unless such fine and costs are sooner paid.

Sec. 4. Each police officer in the village of Glyndon is hereby authorized and directed to arrest without warrant, any person violating the provisions of section one of this ordinance; and upon such arrest, if it be a first arrest under this ordinance, such minor person shall be delivered into the hands of his parent, guardian or employer, if it be a second or any subsequent arrest for violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance, such person shall be taken before a justice of the peace for trial in the same manner as other accused persons are brought to trial and upon conviction of having violated any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined as hereinbefore provided, but no such minor person so arrested shall be placed in confinement before trial until his parent, guardian or legal custodian shall have been notified of such arrest and shall have refused to furnish sufficient security for the appearance of such minor person at this trial.

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of any justice of the peace of the village of Glyndon from whom such minor person may be brought, charged with the violation of section one of this ordinance, to inquire into the facts of said arrest and the condition and circumstances of the person so arrested and if it shall appear that such person so arrested as aforesaid is growing up in vagrancy, or is becoming incorrigible, to take steps to send such minor person to the State Training School provided for such persons.

Sec. 6. This ordinance shall take effect
