AFFIDAVIT OF PUBLICATION MOORHEAD DAILY NEWS.

Approved Sept. 3, 1941. AN ORDINANCE Regulating the Erection, Alteration Or Repair of Buildings in the Village of Glyndon, Minn.

Wayne Peterson

being duly sworn, on oath says: that he now is and during the times herein

mentioned has been one of the printers...of the MOORHEAD DAILY NEWS, and has full knowledge of the facts hereinafter stated; that for more than one year prior to the publication therein of the legal publication hereinafter described, said newspaper has been and is a daily newspaper printed and published in the City of Moorhead, County of Clay, State of Minnesota, every day (except Sundays and holidays) of each week; that during all that time said newspaper has been printed in the English language from its known office of publication within the city from which it purports to be issued as above stated in column and sheet from equivalent in space to at least 450 running inches of single column two inches wide; has been issued from a known office established in said place of publication and equipped with skilled workmen and the necessary material for preparing and printing the same; that part of the press work is done in its known office of publication; that in its makeup not less than twenty-five per cent of its news columns have been devoted to local news of interest to the community it purports to serve; that it has not wholly duplicated any other publication, and has not been entirely made up of patent, plate matter and advertisements; that it has been circulated in and near its said place of publication to the extent of at least two hundred and forty (240) copies regularly delivered to paying subscribers and had entry as second class matter in its local post-office; and that there is on file in the office of the County Auditor of Clay County, Minnesota, the affidavit of a person having knowledge of the facts, showing the name and location of said newspaper and the existence of the conditions constituting its qualifications as a legal newspaper; and that its publishers have complied with all demands of said County Auditor for proofs of its said qualifications.

Be it Obtained by the Village Council of the Village of Glyndon, Minnesota, as follows: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, co-partnership or co-operation to erect or substantially alter or repair any building in the Village of Glyndon without having obtained a permit from the Village Council of the village of Glyndon so to do, in accordance with the provision hereinafter set forth. Section 2. All person, persons, co-partnerships or corporations desiring to erect any building or substantially repair any old building shall, before erecting, altering or repairing same, file an application with the Village Clerk, stating the legal description of the property upon which said new building is to be erected or old building is to be altered or repaired. The proposed size, dimension of the building which is to be erected, or to which the old building is to be changed or modified, the character and quality of the material to be used therein, the purpose for which said building is to be used and the cost of the proposed erection, repairs or alterations. Section 3. No person or persons shall construct, alter or repair, or move any building or structure of any kind within the limits of the Village of Glyndon, except in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance as far as the same are hereby made applicable thereto. Section 4. Upon the filing of said application with the Village Clerk of the Village of Glyndon, the Council shall immediately consider said application and either approve or reject same, provided however that the applicant shall have the opportunity of appearing before the Council at the time the said application is considered and fully explain to said Council in detail such inquiries as may be made in reference to said application. The Council shall have the power to designate to the applicant any changes that should be made in the application so as to conform with protection against fire, sanitary or nuisance. Section 5. There shall be no application fee necessary to be paid by the applicant under the terms of this ordinance, but that any building erected, constructed or repaired under the provisions hereof shall be subject to the Ordinance of the Village of Glyndon regulating plumbing, protection against fire, sanitary, or general nuisance conditions. Section 6. Any owner, builder or contractor who shall construct or cause to be constructed and any architect having charge of the same who shall permit to be constructed any building in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable to the penalties and punishments provided hereafter. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, unless herein, otherwise provided be subject to a fine of not more than Twenty-five Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for every day of imprisonment until fine is paid, not exceeding 90 days in jail, and each day of imprisonment shall be deemed a separate violation.
