ORDINANCE NO. 31  
ORDINANCE FOR THE ORGANIZATION AND REGULATION OF VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

Be it enacted and ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Glyndon as follows:

Section I

Article 1. The Fire Department shall consist of a Chief and one Assistant and at least 20 firemen of the age of twenty-one (21) years and over and who are citizens and residents of the Village of Glyndon. Not less than six (6) members shall be employed within the Village. All

appointments shall be made subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Glyndon.

Article 2. The Chief, Assistant Chief and a Departmental Steward shall constitute a Board of Fire Officers, which Board shall have entire and absolute control over the management of the Department subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Glyndon to which approval the acts of said Board of Fire Officers shall only be subject as herein and specifically provided.

Article 3. The Board of Fire Officers is hereby authorized, empowered and required from time to time to adopt a code of by-laws and rules for the control, management and government of the Department which code or codes of by-laws and rules after adoption by such Board shall not become effective and operative until presented to and approved by membership of the Department and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Glyndon.

Section II

Article 1. The Chief and Assistant Chief shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Glyndon for an indefinite term. They shall be removable only for cause after hearing before said Board of Trustees.

Article 2. In all cases of fire the Chief or in his absence, the Assistant shall have full power and absolute control and command, and cause the fire equipment to be worked in most advantageous manner. The Chief or his Assistant are hereby vested with full and complete police authority at and near the scene of a fire within the limits of the village.

Section III

Article 1. All ordinances and sections of ordinances in conflict with the foregoing are hereby repealed. Adopted and Approved this 5th day of April 1954.

That the .....
