

ORDINANCES, RULES, REGULATIONS, AND BY-LAWS

of the Village of Glyndon, Clay County, Minn.

Village Ordinance No. 12.

An ordinance relating to Public Health.
The village council of the village of Glyndon do ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. All persons are forbidden to allow the accumulation of manure, ashes, decaying vegetable or animal matter, or any ~~substance~~ rubbish unsightly, or in its nature detrimental to the public health.

Sec. 2. If any person, after three days notice from the health officer or any member of the board of health, refuses to remove any accumulation considered by the board as being detrimental to the health of the village, the same shall be removed under the direction of the board and the expense of such removal shall be a lien against the property from which the removal has been made.

Sec. 3. The health officer shall report at once to the village council the cost and expense of such removal of such substance, giving a detailed description of the lot, lots or parcels of land from which such substance has been removed, and such report shall be carefully filed by the village recorder, and the village council shall once in each year and prior to the first of October assess and levy upon each of the lots and parcels of land mentioned in such reports the cost of removing such substances. This assessment shall be delivered to the county auditor and be collected by him the same as any other taxes.

Sec. 4. Any renter or lessee of any building or premises within the limits of the village of Glyndon who, after three days notice from the health officer or any member of the board, refuses or neglects to remove any accumulation of any matter deemed detrimental to the public health by the board of health, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not more than twenty (20) dollars nor less than five (5) dollars together with the costs of prosecution and in default of payment of such

fine and costs shall be confined in the county
jail not to exceed thirty days.

Sec. 5. Any person who shall wilfully oppose
or obstruct a health officer or physician charged
with the enforcement of the health laws in perform-
ing any legal duty, shall be guilty of a mis-
demeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be
subject to a fine of not less than five dollars
(\$5.00) and not more than twenty five dollars (\$25.00)
together with the costs of prosecution and in default
of payment of such fine and costs shall be con-
fined in the county jail not more than thirty
(30) days.
