

Ordinance # 24

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SPEED OF VEHICLES ON THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE RESIDENCE PORTION OF THE VILLAGE OF GLYNDON, CLAY COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

The Village Council of the Village of Glyndon, Clay County, Minnesota, do ordain as follows:

Section 1.

Any person driving a vehicle on any street or public highway within the Village of Glyndon, shall drive the same at a speed not greater than is reasonable and proper having due regard for the traffic, the width of the road and other conditions then existing.

Section 2.

Operating a vehicle at a speed greater than thirty miles an hour on said streets and highways extending from the Great Northern Railway Company tracks across United States Highway No. 10 on the west to the speed limit signs on ~~six~~ said highway entering said village from the east, and extending north of said highway on State Highway No. 82 a distance of six hundred feet, and south on said village streets and said State Highway to where they enter the residence portion of the Village, all of which locations and distances are held to be within such residence portion, shall be prima facie evidence that the operator of said vehicle is driving the same at a speed greater than is reasonable and proper as herein defined.

Section 3.

This ordinance shall not be deemed to affect or change any regulation as to speed through a school zone as provided by law.

Section 4.

Any person operating a vehicle in violation of the foregoing provision, shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not exceeding One hundred dollars and the costs of the prosecution, or by imprisonment in the county jail of said county for a period not exceeding ninety days, if the said fine and costs are not paid.

Section 5.

This Ordinance shall be in force from its adoption and publication as required by law.
